
Visual Arts Portfolio


Title:"Te invito a mi casa!"

Technique: Collaborative video collage Dimensions: 1920 x 1080, 4:48, 29,9 fps.

Year: 2021-2022

The artist explores meme politics and democracy reduction in Latin America through a collaborative video collage. By collaborating with international participants, the work reflects how political memes shape perceptions of politics globally. During the 2021-2022 election period, the artist incorporated images of Gabriel Boric, reflecting the use of digital communication for political propaganda. The dynamic nature of video as a medium highlights the viral spread of political memes.
